
Centre Background

- We provide various talks, workshops and services to schools in order to enhance the communication skills and improve interpersonal relationship among children and youth, parents and teachers.

Advocacy: Raising public awareness

Studies on "Happiness Index of Hong Kong People" (2002–2006)


Happiness Index (2002-2006)



Happiness Indices: Respondents were asked to choose from a scale of 1 to 10, with 10 referring to "very happy"

Surveys on "How Hong Kong People Deal with Interpersonal Conflicts" (2006–2009)

Index of Forgiveness (2006–2009)



Forgiveness Index: Respondents were asked to choose from a scale of 1 to 10, with 10 referring to a high willingness to forgive.

Surveys on "How Hong Kong People Deal with Interpersonal Conflicts 2006-2009"

- Adopt RP to restore relationship is not popular in Hong Kong over the past few years;
- Most respondents tend to wait for others to take initiative to restore their broken relationships;
- If the other party indicates a willingness to restore the relationship, 71.8% (2009 survey) respondents would accept the move (2009).

Restoration Day & City-wide Variety Show Programs (2006)

Restoration Day & City-wide Variety Show Programs

- A three-day restoration justice campaign;
- Encourage people to amend their broken relationships with family members, lovers, colleagues, classmates, and others;
- A large group of Criminology students participated in the campaign as Student Ambassadors for Restoration.

Restoration Day: Feb 25, 2006

- We organized parade marching all the way in downtown;
- Flyers, cards and souvenirs were given out to encourage the public to restore interpersonal relationships --- learn to say sorry to those you have harmed or ask for forgiveness;
- Encourage people to amend their wrongdoings and promote restoration of relationships.

City-wide Variety Show Programs Feb 24 & 26, 2006

- Encourage people to amend their wrongdoings and promote restoration of relationships;
- "Angels of Restoration";
- Criminology students provided logistics support and took charge of program run-down.

Service: Using RP in schools

Whole-school Approach

- To promote a harmonious environment in schools for the prevention of bullying and reconciliation of students' conflicts.
- The activities including training groups for the bully, victim and bystander, training workshops and talks for teachers, parents, and students.

Restorative Conference Facilitator Training


- We conduct the trainings in accordance with the script and video provided by Real Justice.
- We have trained over 1000 participants in Hong Kong and Macau since 2003. The training targeted at school principal, teacher, social worker, probation officer, psychologist, lawyer, policeman and student etc.

Peer Restorative Practices Training

- We have designed this training for senior students (F. 4 to F.6) in accordance with the script and video provided by Real Justice since 2006.
- We have trained over 162 participants which included school prefects and leaders of student union.
- After the training, the students will be able to assist teachers and others to develop a harmonious school life.

Restorative Conference

- We also provide consultation and conference to assist schools on resolving conflicts and bullying.
- In our experiences, we have 46 successful cases since 2007.

We organize seminars and publish bulletins to introduce the development and importance of Restorative Justice and share our works to schools and social service agencies.









Tackling School Bullying with RJ Approach




Case Sharing: Using Conference

Case Background

Case Nature: Students bullying and conflict

Victim: One S.1 student




Case Background

- Simon, a fourteen-year old boy walked to the playground in the recess.
- His classmate, Kelvin was playing in the playground. Kelvin complained Simon was disturbing them to play football when he stand in middle of the playground.
- Kelvin dissatisfied Simon's behavior and was angry with him. Then, Kelvin wanted to "teach Simon a lesson" together with his friends by their "own ways" after school.



Case Development

- Physical violence was the result. Simon's mother concerned the harmless towards Simon and decided to report to the police.
- The victim was bullied by Kelvin and his friends for a period of time. This event was the most seriously one and Simon was hurt physically and psychologically this time.
- The school principal invited us to resolve the conflicts by using of restorative conference.

Conclusion

- Unresolved conflicts may cause serious event.
- Restorative conference is an another method to solve interpersonal conflict, except reporting to the police.
- Restorative conference could be an effective method to solve interpersonal conflicts.
