A Restorative Approach to Sustaining Truancy Reduction and Improving School Attendance

- The Accountability Conferencing process for Truancy cases is generally the same as is done for victimless crimes.
- The regular script is followed, using the amendments provided for victimless crimes

 Meeting with the Student (and his or her families) is important to help them to understand what Accountability Conferencing is and why Humberside Police are involved in a "school issue"

One difference during a Truancy Conference would be to have a school representative attending the conference instead of a community representative. When choosing a school representative to attend the conference, it is important to choose someone that the student likes and respects (as a support person and as a school official.)

- Often the student has many concerns about certain school officials, and it is not productive to have those people as support persons.
- However if there are issues with a specific school official, it is important to include them in the conference in order to decide how to get that situation resolved.

- This helps to get the student back into school and repair the harm done to the school community and the students themselves.
- It is important to include that official and another official that will serve as a support person for the student not attending school.

- Having support persons that work at the school—teachers, principles, volunteers tutors, etc... is important in these Conferences to foster an atmosphere of caring and reconciliation.
   The student may also invite any other support persons be or she would like to be personal to be p
  - support persons he or she would like to attend the conference.

 Meeting with the student will help in deciding which school officials (Tutor, welfare officer etc.) should attend the conference.

The agreement phase will vary with each case, just as with regular Conferencing.
Some suggestions in preparing the school and student for the agreement phase are.
Ask the school what they can offer the student as an incentive to attend school.

- Ask the student for ideas that would make it easier for them to attend school.
- Ask the family and support persons to think of ways that they could help get the student to attend school.

Once an agreement has been reached a contract is signed by everyone at the conference and the agreement is turned into the school and considered "official."
This means that if the student does not honour the agreement, the case will be

referred for further action/referrals.


