Neighborhood Reconciliation Services

- Small, nonprofit organization
- Mission is to educate and train community members with the goal of implementing Restorative Practices
- Conferencing, community service program, truancy program, education program







- Total Population = 5,689,283
- 14.5% Have no high school diploma
- 11% High School drop out rate among teens (30,000)
- Ranked 45th in US in number of high school dropouts
- Median Income of \$36,360



- Total Population: 55,469
- 23.7% of population below 19 years of age
- Median Income \$30,835
- 15.9% of the population were below the poverty line
- •One Middle School-grades 6-7—enrollment of 1073
- •One High School—2 campuses
 - •8/9 campus—enrollment of 1104
 - •10-12 grade campus—enrollment of 1381
 - Alternative Learning Center



Truancy is..

- Defined as chronic absences from school
- Very Costly
- A stepping stone to delinquency
- Multi-layered problem
- Multi-generational
- A community issue

Conventional ways of handling

- Schools file petition with sheriff or local juvenile court
- Hearing before Judge
- Student placed probation
- Parents can be fined up to \$50 per unexcused absence
- Student can be removed from home & placed into state custody

How did we get started?

- Talk, Talk, Talk, Talk
 Listen, Listen, Listen
 Be Available
 - Collaborate
 - Experiment
 - Be willing to fail

Process



- 5 unexcused absences—letter to parents
- 5+ unexcused absences petition filed with juvenile

 3 unexcused absences—contact with parents by school official Court
Parents, student and

school officials appear before judge. Facilitator is present. Judge reads charge and makes sure that all parties understand reasons for hearing.



Parents and student are given options of how case can proceed.

Only 2 cases were heard by judge after program was implemented. If conference is chosen, then parents, student and school officials leave courtroom with facilitator.

Agreement Phase

- Options for facilitator
- Input from all parties
- Differing from the REAL JUSTICE Conferencing model, the facilitator is not neutral and can make suggestions as to agreements
- Has legal teeth in it!! Legal sanctions if not followed

- Provided alarm clocks to students
- Inadequate clothing
- Field trip expenses
- Transportation issues
- Language difficulties
- Chronic medical conditions
- Migrant medical care
- Parent's education







Follow Through

- Attendance Checks
- Set deadlines on agreement
- School and facilitator communication is VITAL!!
- Positive Reinforcement to parents and student

Statistics

- 53% cases dismissed
- 46% cases deferred to conferences
- 93% agreements completed
- 73% students attended summer school
- 20% referred to school counselor
- 20% referred to outside services
