

Why Souderton?

- ♦ High School Enrollment = 1600, grades 10-12
- ♦ Behavioral discipline referrals
 - -03-04 total = 1570
 - Recidivism...
- ♦ School Spirit
- ♦"Involvement Gap"

- •Three year implementation plan
- •Colloquium formation





Three Year Plan

- Colloquia of 40 secondary teachers for first two years
- Full staff training at SAHS slated for November, 2006
- ♦ Continue colloquium model in other schools

Restorative Practices for Administrators Souderton Area




- ◆ Summer administrative retreat for restorative supervision
