The conference will feature several plenary speakers, including Nigel Richardson, whose vision of a family-friendly city has led to training in restorative practices for 23,000 professionals and volunteers throughout the city. Beginning with educators, police, social workers and others in the Riverside section of Hull, and expanding to a wide variety of agencies throughout the city,

the Hull Centre for Restorative Practices is using training programmes developed by the [International Institute for Restorative Practices](#).

Estelle MacDonald, head teacher of Collingwood Primary School, will tell the story of her school's journey from special measures to outstanding through the implementation of restorative practices.

Chris Straker, head teacher of Endeavour High School, shares his similar experiences using restorative practices to dramatically improve the culture in his school, reducing exclusions, reducing teacher absenteeism and boosting both student and teacher morale.

This international conference will not only feature these accomplishments in the "world's first restorative city," but will include educationalists, social care and criminal justice professionals from many countries who, in small breakout sessions, will share their experiences in effectively using restorative practices.

The conference will also screen a number of dramatic films showing the potential of restorative practices in [education](#), [criminal justice](#), [social work](#) and [workplaces](#).
