WE INVITE YOU TO ATTEND OUR 2010 WORLD CONFERENCE. SUBMIT A 50-MIN. BREAKOUT SESSION PROPOSAL BY APRIL 6.

The conference will spotlight the city of Hull, which is bringing restorative practices training to its 23,000 professionals and volunteers who work with children and young people. Beginning with educators, police, social workers and others in the Riverside section of Hull, and expanding to a wide variety of agencies throughout the city, the Hull Centre for Restorative Practices is using training programs developed by the International Institute for Restorative Practices.

**AN INTERDISCIPLINARY CONFERENCE.** This international conference will not only feature these accomplishments in the “world’s first restorative city,” but will include educationalists, social care and criminal justice professionals from many countries who, in small breakout sessions, will share their experiences in effectively using restorative practices. The conference will also screen a number of dramatic films showing the potential of restorative practices in education, criminal justice, social work and workplaces.

**WHO SHOULD ATTEND.** Social workers, teachers, school administrators, probation officers, police, researchers, community volunteers, criminologists, counselors, peacemakers, academicians, judges, public planners, corrections officers and others.

**A PARTICIPATORY EXPERIENCE.** Most IIRP conference presenters are not professional speakers. Aside from a few featured speakers (see sidebar) and videos, our conferences are created by you and others like you who have submitted proposals to present in 50-minute breakout sessions. We encourage you to share your experiences and knowledge. No formal papers are required. Presenters receive a reduced registration rate.

- (1) **a brief biography, including relevant information about your work, for each presenter** (50–75 words each, in paragraph form), to be published in the conference program book. Bios longer than 75 words will be edited for length.
- (2) **a brief summary of your session** (100–150 words, in paragraph form), to be published in the conference program book. When writing your summary, please consider that conference participants will be determining their breakout session choices based largely on session summaries. Summaries longer than 150 words will be edited for length.

For items 1 and 2, please specify the locales of programs and organizations mentioned and define any abbreviations or acronyms.

- (3) **answers to the following questions** (1-2 paragraphs each):
  - (a) Who is the prospective audience for your proposed session?
  - (b) How does your session relate to restorative practices?
- (4) **copies of this form for co-presenters' contact information**, specifying the primary contact.

**Please note:** Applicants will be notified by 14 May 2010. Accepted presenters are expected to register for the three-day conference by 25 June 2010, at the special reduced rate of £350 (regular rate £400). Presenters are responsible for their own travel and lodging. Two presenters for each presentation can register for the conference at the reduced rate. Additional co-presenters must pay the full registration fee.
