


Just Justice - Unequal income



Communitarian Restorative Justice Forum

- 2 ½ day 100 people, 10 states
- Sharing about social, educational and political engagement, focusing on

Community relations: indigenous, afrobrazilian, rural, urban;

Gender relations;

Racial and institutional violence;

Socioeconomic inequalities.

METHODOLOGY Communitarian Restorative Justice Forum

- Theoretical inputs, circle conversation, plenary
- Exposition of practices, circle conversation, plenary,
- Celebrations, cultural moments, spirituality

1. Knowledge and deepening of the scope of (the) Communitarian Restorative Justice and how it generates and catalyzes energy to involve people from communities in processes of change, in cooperative practices, appropriate to the current political and social situation in Brazil.

2. Approach to "Justice" that takes into account structural issues: class, race, gender, inequalities, differences and identities that awakens and increases the desire for greater engagement of the participants in the daily application of the principles of RJ in their daily life and in professional practice.

3. The methodology enabled dialogue as an exercise in understanding and respecting the other, interacting, exchanging and building empathic relationships in simplicity.

4. Contact with the force of music, poetry and celebration; cultural moments as a consecration of diversity in the mix of traditions and beliefs celebrated in the circle (spirituality)
