Reading, Pennsylvania, USA

- 88,000 Residents
- 52.3% of children under age 5 live below the poverty level
- 62% are of Hispanic origins
- 12.6% Unemployment rate
- 19.7% Births to teen mothers 15-19 years of age
- 70% of children entering kindergarten lack one or more of the skills needed to be successful in school

PROTECTING YOUTH

The **more assets** a child or adolescent has in his or her life, the **less likely** they are to engage in behaviors such as alcohol, drug and /or tobacco use, early sexual activity, violence and anti-social behaviors, depression, attempted suicide, gambling and driving under the influence.

PROMOTING YOUTH

In addition to protecting youth from negative behaviors, having more assets increases the chances that young people will succeed in school, maintain good health, delay gratification, value diversity, exhibit leadership, overcome adversity and help others.

Right from the Start Initiative

A series of programs aimed to support a young child's development and improve a parent's ability to be the best first teacher for their child(ren).

- BABY COLLEGE a parenting and educational support program
- RAISING A READER an award winning rotational book bag program that promotes bonding and lap reading & builds preliteracy skills
- PLAY & LEARN neighborhood drop-in centers that engage parents & their children in fun interactive developmental activities and increases social and emotional connections with others

Four Year Demographics

- **56%** of participants were single mothers (21% lived with father of child)
- 13% of participants were fathers
- 77% were Hispanic; 13% were Caucasian & 12% were African American;
- 58% were receiving WIC subsidies & 36% were receiving Food Stamps

Four Year Outcomes

Before Baby College

 16% of participants strongly agree they know what to expect at the different ages & stages of their child's development

After Baby College

84% Strongly Agreed

- 25% of participants strongly agree they understand the importance of creating routines for their children
- 93% Strongly Agreed

Four Year Outcomes

Before Baby College

- 19% of participants strongly agree they know how to positively discipline their child
- 35% of participants strongly agree they know how to create a safe home for their child
- 31% of participants strongly agree they understand what to do to influence their child's development

After Baby College

• 84% Strongly Agreed

93% Strongly Agreed

89% Strongly Agreed

Additional Outcomes


- 100% of children were covered by medical insurance & were properly immunized
- 71% of children were tested for lead
- 21% were assessed to be developmentally delayed and were referred for early intervention services
- 60% of parents reported that they read, sing & play everyday with their child (80% report doing so 3-5 times/ week)
- 94% of parents reported now feeling confident in their ability to parent effectively

Unexpected Outcomes

- 47% of participants
 returned to school for their
 GED, ESL or higher education
- 24% of participants had
 100% attendance (82% attended 80% of the classes)
- Many participants began to form play groups after Baby College

Restorative Tools

- **BELIEVE** in your participants
- DO NOT shame help participants have a healthy response to shame
- Use PROACTIVE facilitation skills
- BUILD on their ideas and thoughts
- CLARIFY points of confusion
- HELP your participants find the space to heal and grow

Critical Facilitation Skills

- Are your questions the keys that unlock potential?
- Are you creating strength-based & solution focused conversations?
- Are you applying effective listening skills?
- Does your body language, your voice, and your eyes say you care?
- Is the environment conducive to learning?


Restorative Practices & Principles Common Threads

Funding & Budget Information

- Initial funding came from a US Federal Grant (\$1.7M)
- Ongoing funding was provided by United Way of Berks County, local hospitals & foundations, philanthropic & fund raising dollars
- Approximate cost per year (3 classes/cycle x 3 cycles/year = \$ 208,000
 - Baby College utilized volunteers, donations & good fiscal responsibility to hold costs steady
