





- Under 18's population stable for the period under review but forecasted to rise over next 10 years
- Age group (12 18) rising by 70,000 between now and 2020

Irish Criminal Justice System

- The traditional ADVERSARIAL/Common Law system is based on a retributive model of justice as distinct from a restorative system
- Change with regard to Children/Young People
- "There is an underlying gap in our Criminal Justice System which is not fully met and never could be met by criminal injury compensation schemes or recourse to civil redress. The gap is caused by the absence of a place for the telling, the vindication and attempt of healing the victim" (President Mary McAleese, 2001)

Garda (Police) Diversion System

- The System: age, criminal responsibility
- Formal Cautions: 'restorative caution'
- Informal Cautions
- Irish victim participation rates high by international standards (76%)
- Reconciliation (victim & offender)
- Reparation (offender taking responsibility)
- Transformation (community/public)
- Restorative process: humanising effect

Restorative Justice Feedback – Garda/Police

Restorative Justice:

'taps into **emotions**, in contrast to the dispassionate discourse in a **court setting**; anger and **aggression** featured in several cases; **angry remarks** were as likely to come from the offender's own family as the victim's side; It isn't for **everybody**, it isn't a panacea and **not every case** is a success'
